At **Cross Stitch Workshop** we know the amount of work involved in creating a cross stitch masterpiece - after all, we've done a few ourselves! So when you want to convert a photograph of your child, grandchildren, dog, cat, budgie, house, whatever, into a design, it is important that the people you trust to do this for you take the same care in creating the design as you will when stitching it.

Following the instructions below, complete this form and send it to us with your original. Alternatively, sent the original as an attachment to an email giving all relevant information asked for below. After doing an initial scan of your original, we will send you a provisional proof by email or by first class post. We will then talk on the phone to discuss the proof and any changes you may want to make to it. At that time, we will be able to give you a price for the job.

Remember, you are under no obligation to continue until after you are happy with what we offer.

Step 2 - The original

The original does not have to be a photo - a child's drawing or any other artwork can be converted into a pattern. Your original can be paper-based or in digital format. Just remember that we can only work with what you send us - for example, a photo where faces are in deep shadow is unlikely to give satisfactory results. If we have any concerns about your original, we'll give you a call before proceeding. Your original will be returned to you along with your completed pattern.

First, we ask that you sign here to confirm that **Cross Stitch Workshop** will not be in breach of copyright by processing this original.

If you want the whole of the original to be processed, please put a tick in this box -

if you want us to crop the original so that only part of it is processed into your pattern, describe opposite what you want us to do. You can either do a sketch illustrating your requirements (honest - we shan't laugh!) or specify what you want in words.

Step 3 - The pattern

We can make your pattern as large or as small as you want. Just remember that, if you make it too small, people or objects may be unrecognisable. On the other hand, if you make it very large - well, it's you that has the job of stitching it! As a guide, we suggest that each face in a pattern should have at least 60 stitches across - the examples below have been done, from left to right, for 40, 60, 80, 100 and 120 stitches across the face. Using these as a guide, work out the design width (in stitches) so that the pattern will give you the level of detail you require. (Don't worry about the height; we'll work that out based on the width you give and your cropping instructions above.)
